

Careers Advice, Information and Guidance Provision (CEIAG) at Ipswich Academy

In line with the Gatsby Benchmarks, Year 7 – 11 students learn about the world of work and develop their employability skills through an enriched curriculum of contextualised learning opportunities and specific learning tasks; this is supported by an independent and impartial careers guidance professional. In all year groups, CEIAG is delivered during PSHE lessons, base group sessions, assemblies and enrichment days. Students have opportunities to visit places of work as well as FE and HE organisations. All students take part in the Ipswich Academy Careers Fair which takes place every year on the school site.
