### **ActiveLearn Online Homework**

Dear parent/carer,

We are writing to inform you that following the widespread use of online homework in different subjects, we have re-issued usernames and passwords for all students so that they have one account for all online learning.

In planning for wider use of this resource, we have decided to use a common password and username for access to all subjects, rather than setting up different access arrangements for each subject. This change should provide your child access to a powerful learning resource across a range of subjects.

Your child's username and password for all subjects is stated here:

Username: ***Issued individually to students in letter sent home with them***

Password: ***Issued individually to students in letter sent home with them***

Steps to log in, are as follows:

- 1) Go to the website [www.pearsonactivelearn.com](http://www.pearsonactivelearn.com)
- 2) Enter username and password
- 3) Read and agree to the EULA
- 4) Set two memorable answers in case of forgotten password
- 5) Click and complete the tasks that have been assigned

We will continue to provide lunchtime support for students unable to access the internet at home, or for any students having technical issues; Darren Bloom our IT Technician will also be available to assist as required to resolve



any log in issues that may have arisen. Subject support will be running at the following times:

- MFL: Tuesdays and Wednesdays in the blue area IT room
- Science: Wednesday and Thursday lunchtimes in the grey area IT room

Students will be able to use academy computers to complete the online homework in the SYSZ after school should they not have access at home. Due to the fact that we are offering this provision, there is the expectation that all students will complete all their online work over the period allocated by their teacher.
